SPRING GREEN FARM WINDMILL 1926 TO 2014

Upon the European trip, 1926, of Mr. & Mrs. Frank Hail Brown his Alice Francis owner of Spring Green farm hired & appointed my father, Francis Hail Brown, as manager of Spring Green Farm.

Gaspee Point or High Banks with its summer campers was one of the many operations required to manage the estate of 400 acres, water front camp-sights in particular with access to the beach were choice sights over looking Narragansett Bay were quickly developed. Camp leased sights in 1926 numbered less than 120, but with father management grew to 300 at the time of his death in 1950.

Management problems multiplied with an increase of campers. Health concerns were addressed with a supply of fresh water supplied by deep three wells adjacent to a small pond, 25 feet deep, with adjacent towering windmill with a 1200 gallon Cyprus-wood tank gravity feeding water to the campers. When the wind blew the tin vanes atop the mill, it in turned, caught wind emitting a force to operated a pump to draw water from the wells. As Murphy's Law dictates the mill often failed to provide water---no wind often time, bad connections, vacuum failed to draw water, a drought with a low water table. etc. In 1927/8 electricity came to the camp ground and with it a line to the mill. A small shed housed the "Duro" pump pushing water into the tank. Within the tank a ball valve & float opened & closed. A signal to the pump water to maintain a steady flow of water. A spider web of ¾" galvanized pipe interspersed every 100 feet a draw off valves. A great connivance from earlier gathers of water that was obtained from natural flowing springs, emitting from beneath the High Bank, but carried a long distance.

Soon following WW2, 1946, water usage outstripped the volume consumed by the campers. A 2 inch galvanized water line was run from Spring Green Road, near the entrance to the farm, 3500-2500 feet into the camp ground. Here summer campers could connect to a steady indoor supply to a kitchen, & bath room.


State and city regulations required in door flush toilets closing down all outhouses within the city by 1948/9. My father worked to obtain city water [Situate water] that was installed a 6 inch water line "Johns-Manville transite" by Byron Jordan¹, contractor, throughout camp ground with fire hydrants throughout.

The windmill was a relics having been abandoned in 1946 but saw new life in 1958 when it was transported in three sections to my sister pond. I having begun a small plant nursery & moved the wind mill to Spring Green farm adjacent to a pond on the property of Elizabeth F. Brown, to irrigated yew, juniper & Rhododendron plants. My expanded business, Governor Francis Nursery, dealt with large a volume of plant material & water thus the system not adequate was abandoned.

In the 1980/90's my sisters 2nd husband, Phyllip Holton attempted to silence the squeaking & turning of the directional head by destroying the metal tail that kept the vanes upwind to gather wind. He with a heavy gage pistol shot the tail off, but photographically captured the abandoned stately tower & tank. The windmill has been a home to raccoons and now encumbered with vines of honeysuckle & bittersweet.


